3	<p><b>afford</b> <i>verb</i> /ə' fōrd/            Have enough money to pay for  <i>The family could <b>afford</b> a nice long vacation at Disneyland.</i></p>
4	<p><b>amnesia</b> <i>noun</i> \am-' nē-zhə\            Loss of memory due usually to brain injury, shock, fatigue, repression, or illness  <i>In the movie Anastasia, the main character suffered <b>amnesia</b> after an injury to her head</i></p>
5	<p><b>angst</b> <i>noun</i> /aNG(k)st/            A feeling of persistent worry about something trivial  <i>Financial experts expressed their <b>angst</b> at the crumbling world economy.</i></p>
6	<p><b>aquatic</b> <i>adj</i> \ə-' kwä-tik\            Growing or living in or frequenting water  <i>Sara has a fascination with <b>aquatic</b> creatures.</i></p>
7	<p><b>astronaut</b> <i>noun</i> /' astrə, nôt/            A person who is trained to travel in a spacecraft  <i>The <b>astronaut</b> landed and walked on the moon.</i></p>
8	<p><b>avenue</b> <i>noun</i> /' avə, n /            A broad road in a town or city, typically having trees at regular intervals along its sides  <i>Mark walked down the quiet <b>avenue</b> until he reached his house.</i></p>
9	<p><b>beautiful</b> <i>adj</i> \ 'byü-ti-fəl\            Having qualities of beauty : exciting aesthetic pleasure  <i>This is a <b>beautiful</b> day for a picnic.</i></p>
10	<p><b>believe</b> <i>verb</i> \bə-' lēv\            To accept something as true, genuine, or real  <i>I couldn't <b>believe</b> my eyes when I saw all the snow.</i></p>
11	<p><b>blooming</b> <i>noun</i> /' bl m /            flourishing; prospering  <i>The spring flowers began <b>blooming</b> as the warm sun filled the air.</i></p>
12	<p><b>bridle</b> <i>noun</i> /' brīdl/            The headgear used to control a horse, consisting of buckled straps to which a bit and reins are attached  <i>The horse's <b>bridle</b> was slipped over his head and buckled tightly.</i></p>

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13	<p><b>calendar</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'ka-lən-dər\  A system for fixing the beginning, length, and divisions of the civil year and arranging days and longer divisions of time (as weeks and months) in a definite order  <i>The school <b>calendar</b> runs from September through May.</i></p>
14	<p><b>cereal</b> <i>adj.</i> \ 'sir-ē-əl\  Relating to grain or to the plants that produce it; <i>also:</i> made of grain  <i>Some kinds of <b>cereal</b> have a lot of added sugar.</i></p>
15	<p><b>challenge</b> <i>verb</i> \ 'cha-lənʃ\  To order to stop and prove identity  <i>The work doesn't <b>challenge</b> him anymore, and he's often bored.</i></p>
16	<p><b>champion</b> <i>noun</i> / 'CHampēən/  A person who has defeated or surpassed all rivals in a competition, esp. in sports  <i>After spelling all words correctly, Amy was the Spelling Bee <b>Champion</b>.</i></p>
17	<p><b>chemist</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'ke-mist\  One trained in chemistry  <i>Let's ask the <b>chemist</b> whether it's safe to mix these two chemicals.</i></p>
18	<p><b>chronic</b> <i>adj.</i> \ 'krä-nik\  Marked by long duration or frequent recurrence  <i>He suffers from <b>chronic</b> arthritis.</i></p>
19	<p><b>circuit</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'sər-kət\  A moving or revolving around  <i>It takes a year for the Earth to make one <b>circuit</b> around the sun.</i></p>
20	<p><b>clearinghouse</b> <i>noun</i> / 'kl ə r 'h us/  An agency or organization that collects and distributes something, esp. information  <i>The website is an online <b>clearinghouse</b> where teachers can submit ideas for materials or expenses that their students need to learn.</i></p>
21	<p><b>colony</b> <i>noun</i> / 'kälənē/  A group of people living in such a country or area, consisting of the original settlers and their descendants and successors  <i>An ant <b>colony</b> is usually divided up amongst castes or social classes</i></p>
22	<p><b>combination</b> <i>noun</i> / ,käm bə 'nāSHən/  The act or an instance of combining; the process of being combined  <i>The lasagna sauce consisted of the prefect <b>combination</b> of tomatoes and spices.</i></p>
23	<p><b>could</b> <i>verb</i> /k d/  Used to indicate possibility  <i>The dog <b>could</b> either run or walk up the hill.</i></p>
24	<p><b>court</b> <i>noun</i> /kôrt/  A tribunal presided over by a judge, judges, or a magistrate in civil and criminal cases  <i>Steve was scheduled to appear in <b>court</b> to settle the lawsuit.</i></p>

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25	<p><b>cousin</b> <i>noun</i> /'kəzən/  A child of one's uncle or aunt  <i>Tommy's <b>cousin</b> lives with his Uncle and Aunt in Texas.</i></p>
26	<p><b>coyote</b> <i>noun</i> \kī-'ō-tē\  A buff-gray to reddish-gray North American canid (<i>Canis latrans</i>) closely related to but smaller than the wolf  <i>The <b>coyote</b> chased the rabbit across the field.</i></p>
27	<p><b>cushion</b> <i>noun</i> 'ku -shən\  A soft pillow or pad usually used for sitting, reclining, or kneeling  <i>There is a <b>cushion</b> on the chair to make it more comfortable.</i></p>
28	<p><b>definitely</b> <i>adverb</i> \ 'de-fə-nit-lē\  Having distinct or certain limits  <i>I will <b>definitely</b> win the next round in the Spelling Bee.</i></p>
29	<p><b>delicious</b> <i>adj.</i> /d 'l SHəs/  Highly pleasant to the taste.  <i>The chocolate cake was <b>delicious</b>.</i></p>
30	<p><b>design</b> <i>verb</i> \di-'zīn\  To think up and plan out in the mind  <i>They thought they could <b>design</b> the perfect dress to wear to the dance.</i></p>
31	<p><b>disappear</b> <i>verb</i> \,dis-ə-'pīr\  To pass from view  <i>These problems won't just <b>disappear</b> by themselves.</i></p>
32	<p><b>discourage</b> <i>verb</i> \dis-'kər-ij,\  To lessen the courage or confidence of  <i>Try not to let losing <b>discourage</b> you.</i></p>
33	<p><b>earring</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'īr-,r ŋ\  An ornament for the ear and especially the earlobe  <i>The lady wore a beautiful <b>earring</b>.</i></p>
34	<p><b>emotion</b> <i>noun</i> / 'mōSHən/  Any of the particular feelings that characterize such a state of mind, such as joy, anger, love, hate, horror, etc.  <i>He showed no <b>emotion</b> at the comment.</i></p>
35	<p><b>emphasis</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'em(p)-fə-səs\  Forcefulness of expression  <i>Their <b>emphasis</b> is on long-term growth.</i></p>
36	<p><b>emptied</b> <i>verb</i> /'emp teed/  Remove all the contents of (a container)  <i>The janitor <b>emptied</b> all of the office's trashcans.</i></p>

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37	<p><b>environment</b> <i>noun</i> \in-'vī-rə(n)-mənt,\</p> <p>The circumstances, objects, or conditions by which one is surrounded  <i>He grew up in a loving <b>environment</b>.</i></p>
38	<p><b>exceed</b> <i>verb</i> \ik-'sēd\</p> <p>To go beyond a limit  <i>The cost must not <b>exceed</b> \$10.</i></p>
39	<p><b>expensive</b> <i>adj.</i> / k'spens v/</p> <p>Costing a lot of money  <i>The three carat diamond ring was <b>expensive</b>.</i></p>
40	<p><b>expression</b> <i>noun</i> / k'spreSHən/</p> <p>The process of making known one's thoughts or feelings  <i>The <b>expression</b> on her face made me realize how sad she really was.</i></p>
41	<p><b>fattening</b> <i>adj.</i> /' fatn-iNG/</p> <p>Causing an increase in the weight of someone who eats it  <i>The cheesecake was very <b>fattening</b>.</i></p>
42	<p><b>fertilize</b> <i>verb</i> /' fərtl īz/</p> <p>Make (soil) more fertile or productive by adding suitable substances to it  <i>Because our front yard was brown, my Dad decided to <b>fertilize</b> it.</i></p>
43	<p><b>foreign</b> <i>adj.</i> \' f r-ən,\</p> <p>Born in, belonging to, or characteristic of some place or country other than the one under consideration  <i>They've visited many <b>foreign</b> countries.</i></p>
44	<p><b>forward</b> <i>adverb</i> /' fōrwərd/</p> <p>Toward the front; in the direction that one is facing or traveling  <i>The student kept his eyes <b>forward</b> so as not to miss anything the teacher was writing on the board.</i></p>
45	<p><b>freezing</b> <i>adj.</i> /' frēz /</p> <p>Below 32°F (0°C).  <i>The children had to wear their coats at recess due to <b>freezing</b> temperatures.</i></p>
46	<p><b>friendship</b> <i>noun</i> /' frend,SH p/</p> <p>The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends  <i>A healthy <b>friendship</b> is one of communication that time and distance cannot destroy.</i></p>
47	<p><b>fruit</b> <i>noun</i> /fr t/</p> <p>The sweet and fleshy product of a tree or other plant that contains seed and can be eaten as food  <i>The <b>fruit</b> fell off the branch and landed on the ground.</i></p>
48	<p><b>giraffe</b> <i>noun</i> \jə-'raf\</p> <p>The tallest of living quadrupeds; has a very long neck and a short coat with dark blotches separated by pale lines  <i>The <b>giraffe</b> is my favorite animal at the zoo.</i></p>
49	<p><b>gnome</b> <i>noun</i> /nōm/</p> <p>A legendary dwarfish creature supposed to guard the earth's treasures underground  <i>According to legend, a <b>gnome</b> is supposed to guard buried treasure under the earth.</i></p>

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50	<p><b>guess</b> <i>noun</i> /ges/            An estimate or conjecture.  <i>The best way to answer the question is with an educated <b>guess</b>.</i></p>
51	<p><b>height</b> <i>noun</i> /hīt/            The measurement from base to top or (of a standing person) from head to foot  <i>The sheer <b>height</b> of New York's skyscrapers is so impressive.</i></p>
52	<p><b>homonym</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'hä-mə-, nim\            One of two or more words spelled and pronounced alike but different in meaning  <i>The noun "bear" is a <b>homonym</b> to the verb "bear".</i></p>
53	<p><b>hospital</b> <i>noun</i> / 'hɒs.pɪ.təl/            A place where people who are ill or injured are treated and taken care of by doctors and nurses  <i>After Ted broke his arm, he was immediately rushed to the nearest <b>hospital</b> for care.</i></p>
54	<p><b>hyphen</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'hī-fən\            A punctuation mark - used to divide or to compound words or word elements  <i>Don't forget to use a <b>hyphen</b> to divide your word.</i></p>
55	<p><b>iceberg</b> <i>noun</i> / 'ɪs, bɜrg/            A large floating mass of ice detached from a glacier or ice sheet and carried out to sea  <i>The Titanic hit the <b>iceberg</b>.</i></p>
56	<p><b>iguana</b> <i>noun</i> / 'gwänə/            A large, arboreal, tropical American lizard  <i>The <b>iguana</b> sat still on a rock in the hot desert sun.</i></p>
57	<p><b>influenza</b> <i>noun</i> / , nfl 'enzə/            A contagious viral infection of the respiratory passages causing fever, and severe aching  <i><b>Influenza</b> caused the child to have a high fever.</i></p>
58	<p><b>injury</b> <i>noun</i> / ' nʃərē/            The fact of being injured; harm or damage  <i>Due to the football player's severe foot <b>injury</b>, he could not play in the final game.</i></p>
59	<p><b>innocent</b> <i>adj.</i> \ 'i-nə-sənt\            Free from guilt or blame  <i>A person accused of a crime is considered <b>innocent</b> until proven guilty.</i></p>
60	<p><b>investigate</b> <i>verb</i> / n 'vest ,gāt/            Carry out a systematic or formal inquiry to discover and examine the facts of (an incident, allegation, etc.) so as to establish the truth  <i>The detective came to <b>investigate</b> the crime scene.</i></p>
61	<p><b>jaguar</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'ja-, gwär\            A large cat that is brownish yellow or buff with black spots  <i>A <b>jaguar</b> is larger than a leopard.</i></p>

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62	<p><b>jewelry</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'jü-əl-rē \</p> <p>Objects of precious metal often set with gems and worn for personal adornment  <i>Mrs. Jones often wears ladybug jewelry.</i></p>
63	<p><b>laborer</b> <i>noun</i> / 'lāb ə)rər/</p> <p>A person doing unskilled manual work for wages  <i>The laborer picked apples for hours under the hot sun.</i></p>
64	<p><b>lariat</b> <i>noun</i> /lárree ət/</p> <p>A tethering rope, especially one used to hold a grazing animal in one place  <i>The cowboy used the lariat to tie the cow to the fence.</i></p>
65	<p><b>license</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'lī-sən(t)s\</p> <p>A document, plate, or tag evidencing a permission granted  <i>I passed my driving test and got my first license today.</i></p>
66	<p><b>lucid</b> <i>adj.</i> / 'l s d/</p> <p>Expressed clearly; easy to understand  <i>When Cindy's fever broke, she was lucid and no longer delirious.</i></p>
67	<p><b>lucky</b> <i>adj.</i> / 'ləkē/</p> <p>Having, bringing, or resulting from good luck  <i>The Hernandez Family felt lucky when they won the lottery.</i></p>
68	<p><b>macaroni</b> <i>noun</i> \ ,ma-kə- 'rō-nē\</p> <p>Pasta made from semolina and shaped in the form of slender tubes  <i>My kids love macaroni and cheese for dinner.</i></p>
69	<p><b>machine</b> <i>noun</i> \mə- 'shēn\</p> <p>A combination of parts that transmit forces, motion, and energy to do some desired work  <i>Do you know how to operate this machine?</i></p>
70	<p><b>manicure</b> <i>noun</i> / 'man ,k r/</p> <p>A cosmetic treatment of the hands involving cutting, shaping, and often painting the nails  <i>Leslie went to the salon to get a manicure.</i></p>
71	<p><b>marble</b> <i>noun</i> / 'märbəl/</p> <p>A hard crystalline metamorphic form of limestone, typically white with streaks of color  <i>The entrance to their house was done in white marble.</i></p>
72	<p><b>marvelous</b> <i>adj.</i> \märv-(ə-)lə s\</p> <p>Causing wonder, astonishing  <i>Lunch was marvelous today.</i></p>
73	<p><b>merchant</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'mər-chənt\</p> <p>A buyer and seller of goods for profit  <i>The town merchant closed his shop for the parade.</i></p>
74	<p><b>mirage</b> <i>noun</i> \mə- 'rāzh\</p> <p>An optical effect that is sometimes seen at sea, in the desert, or over a hot pavement  <i>After a long, hot day in the desert, I thought I saw a mirage of a pool.</i></p>

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75	<p><b>modern</b> <i>adj.</i> /'mädərn/          Of or relating to the present or recent times as opposed to the remote past  <i>Luke wanted a <b>modern</b> desk to put his new computer on.</i></p>
76	<p><b>necessary</b> <i>adj.</i> \ 'ne-sə-, ser-ē\          Absolutely needed; required  <i>Water is <b>necessary</b> for life.</i></p>
77	<p><b>nephew</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'ne-(,)fyü\          A s n f ne's br ther r s ster, r brother-in-law, sister-in-law  <i>I have a <b>nephew</b> who is also in the third grade.</i></p>
78	<p><b>nerve</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'nərv\          Any of the filamentous bands of nervous tissue that connect parts of the nervous system with the other organs  <i>A <b>nerve</b> is a fiber that sends sensory information to the brain.</i></p>
79	<p><b>newscast</b> <i>noun</i> /'n z,kast/          A radio or television broadcast of news reports  <i>The morning radio <b>newscast</b> interviewed my favorite singer.</i></p>
80	<p><b>niece</b> <i>noun</i> /nēs/          A daughter of one's brother or sister, or of one's brother-in-law or sister-in-law  <i>Bob's <b>niece</b> came over for dinner.</i></p>
81	<p><b>oath</b> <i>noun</i> /ōTH/          A solemn promise, often invoking a divine witness, regarding one's future action or behavior  <i>It's a sworn <b>oath</b> for magicians not to tell the audience how a trick is done.</i></p>
82	<p><b>occurred</b> <i>verb</i> \ə-'kərd\          To come into existence, happened.  <i>An idea <b>occurred</b> to me when I heard that song.</i></p>
83	<p><b>orchestra</b> <i>noun</i> /'ōrk strə/          A group of instrumentalists, esp. one combining string, woodwind, brass, and percussion sections and playing classical music  <i>The <b>orchestra</b> sounded as if they had played together all their lives.</i></p>
84	<p><b>papaya</b> <i>noun</i> /pə'pīə/          A tropical fruit shaped like an elongated melon, with edible orange flesh and small black seeds  <i>The <b>papaya</b> was juicy and delicious.</i></p>
85	<p><b>pleasant</b> <i>adj.</i> \ 'ple-zənt\          Having or characterized by pleasing manners.  <i>She has a very <b>pleasant</b> personality.</i></p>
86	<p><b>production</b> <i>noun</i> /prə'dəkSHən/          The action of making or manufacturing from components or raw materials  <i>Mass <b>production</b> reduces the costs of most goods.</i></p>

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87	<p><b>purchase</b> <i>verb</i> \ 'pər-chəs\          To obtain by paying money.  <i>I need to <b>purchase</b> a new heavy coat.</i></p>
88	<p><b>regular</b> <i>adj.</i> / 'reg ələr/          Arranged in a constant or definite pattern, esp. with the same space between individual instances  <i>You will find service stations at <b>regular</b> intervals along the highway.</i></p>
89	<p><b>revolve</b> <i>verb</i> /r 'vālv/          Move in a circle on a central axis  <i>Satellites <b>revolve</b> around the earth.</i></p>
90	<p><b>sarcasm</b> <i>noun</i> \ 'sär-ka-zəm\          A sharp and often satirical or ironic utterance intended to convey scorn or insult  <i>His <b>sarcasm</b> hurt her feelings.</i></p>
91	<p><b>sausage</b> <i>noun</i> / 'sôs j/          A short cylindrical tube of minced pork, beef, or other meat encased in a skin, typically sold raw to be grilled or fried before eating  <i>Mark added <b>sausage</b> to the lasagna for extra flavor.</i></p>
92	<p><b>scientist</b> <i>noun</i> / 'sīəntist/          A person who is studying or has expert knowledge of one or more of the natural or physical sciences  <i>The <b>scientist</b> studied the three states of matter.</i></p>
93	<p><b>sensation</b> <i>noun</i> /sen 'sāSHən/          A physical feeling or perception resulting from something that happens to or comes into contact with the body  <i>After I sipped the tea, I felt a warm <b>sensation</b> in my throat and stomach.</i></p>
94	<p><b>service</b> <i>noun</i> / 'sərvīs/          The action of helping or doing work for someone  <i>The oil change was a routine <b>service</b>.</i></p>
95	<p><b>shiny</b> <i>adj.</i> / 'SHīnē/          Reflecting light, typically because very clean or polished  <i>The <b>shiny</b> red stone caught my eye.</i></p>
96	<p><b>shoulder</b> <i>noun</i> / 'SHōldər/          The upper joint of each of a person's arms and the part of the body between this and the neck  <i>Her <b>shoulder</b> was sore from pitching all day.</i></p>
97	<p><b>simplicity</b> <i>noun</i> /s m 'pl s tē/          The quality or condition of being easy to understand or do  <i>Tina executed the dance steps with grace and <b>simplicity</b>.</i></p>
98	<p><b>sincerely</b> <i>adverb</i> /sin serlee/          honestly and openly  <i>He <b>sincerely</b> regretted the mistake he had made.</i></p>

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99	<p><b>smirk</b> verb /smɜrk/ Smile in an irritatingly smug, conceited, or silly way <i>The <b>smirk</b> on his face said it all.</i></p>
100	<p><b>sonata</b> noun /sə'nätə/ A classical composition for an instrumental soloist, often with a piano accompaniment <i>He composed the <b>sonata</b> for the violin.</i></p>
101	<p><b>sphere</b> noun /sfi(ə)r/ An object having this shape; a ball or globe. <i>The ball was a perfect <b>sphere</b>.</i></p>
102	<p><b>spinach</b> noun \ 'spi-nich\ Edible leaves. <i>Popeye loves to eat <b>spinach</b>.</i></p>
103	<p><b>stagehand</b> noun / 'stāj, hand/ A person who moves scenery or props before, during, or after the performance of a play <i>The <b>stagehand</b> set the trees up for the play.</i></p>
104	<p><b>strange</b> adj. /strānj/ Unusual or surprising in a way that is unsettling or hard to understand <i>It was a <b>strange</b> day where nothing went like it was supposed to.</i></p>
105	<p><b>striving</b> verb /strīv - ng/ Make great efforts to achieve or obtain something. <i>Linda was <b>striving</b> to get good grades this year.</i></p>
106	<p><b>stylish</b> adj. \ 'stī-lish\ Fashionable, cool. <i>They wore very <b>stylish</b> clothing.</i></p>
107	<p><b>substance</b> noun \ 'səb-stən(t)s\ A fundamental or characteristic part or quality. <i>The floor was covered with a white gooey <b>substance</b>.</i></p>
108	<p><b>sugar</b> noun \ 'shu -gər\ A sweet crystalline substance obtained chiefly from the juice of the sugarcane and the sugar beet. <i>The recipe called for one cup of <b>sugar</b>.</i></p>
109	<p><b>swallowed</b> verb / 'swälō-d/ Cause or allow (something, esp. food or drink) to pass down the throat. <i>Ken <b>swallowed</b> the cherry flavored medicine.</i></p>
110	<p><b>teammate</b> noun / 'tēm, māt/ A fellow member of a team <i>Jim passed the ball to his <b>teammate</b> during the game.</i></p>
111	<p><b>tease</b> verb /tēz/ Make fun of or attempt to provoke (a person or animal) in a playful way <i>Sarah used the stick to <b>tease</b> her cat out from under the deck.</i></p>

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112	<p><b>thrifty</b> <i>adj.</i> /'THr ftē/ Using money and other resources carefully and not wastefully <i>My dad is a <b>thrifty</b> spender.</i></p>
113	<p><b>tomatoes</b> <i>noun</i> \tə-'mā-(, tōz; More than one of a large, round and typically red fruit <i>I like <b>tomatoes</b> on my sandwich.</i></p>
114	<p><b>tortoise</b> <i>noun</i> /'tôrtəs/ A turtle, typically a herbivorous one that lives on land <i>The <b>tortoise</b> had a thick shell that protected his body.</i></p>
115	<p><b>turmoil</b> <i>noun</i> /'tər,m l/ A state of great disturbance, confusion, or uncertainty <i>The earthquake in Haiti has created much <b>turmoil</b>.</i></p>
116	<p><b>umpire</b> <i>noun</i> /'əm,pī ə)r/ An official who watches a game or match closely to enforce the rules and arbitrate on matters arising from the play <i>The <b>umpire</b> wore a black and white striped shirt.</i></p>
117	<p><b>unacceptable</b> <i>adj.</i> \,ən-ik-'sep-tə-bəl\ Not pleasing or welcome. <i>Some movies are <b>unacceptable</b> for young children.</i></p>
118	<p><b>uncle</b> <i>noun</i> /'əNGkəl/ The brother of one's father or mother or the husband of one's aunt <i>My <b>Uncle</b> Tom lives in Florida.</i></p>
119	<p><b>unusual</b> <i>adj.</i> /,ən' H əl/ Not habitually or commonly occurring or done <i>It was <b>unusual</b> to see the cat and dog nap together.</i></p>
